TREASURER'S REPORT at 05/02/2024 -ROBERT BOGIN

The Society year 2023-2024 shows a good level of net income. Membership income currently stands at around 20% less than 2022-2023. The net cost of the Civic Awards evening was £680. We are not anticipating any further exceptional expenses in this year and there is a healthy balance in the accounts.

There was no Heritage Open Days brochure in 2023 other than a 5 page venue listing which was printed in house.

ARCHITECTURE AND PLANNING GROUP – TIM LEE

Planning applications & developments

Along Reigate High Street, the old NatWest building is now occupied by Magnet kitchens and there is a planning application currently in to refurbish the old HSBC branch building into retail space. The Barons building, one of the areas oldest buildings at the end of Church Street is continuing to be refurbished and the reason for the length of the works is that they are having to follow strict instructions from John McInally and it is good to see the developers are doing things correctly and working well with the council.

There is generally a drop off in terms of the amount of development in Redhill and Reigate as developers are not wanting to progress sites due to the current economic climate.

The new padel courts at Reigate lawn Tennis club have been completed but the club will have to wait to fully open them for use as there was an admin error in the planning application which means the council need a period of time needed to rectify that correctly before they can be used.

Redhill Station development

Since their previous planning application and consultation with various groups and residents, Solum have amended their design slightly in terms of reducing the height of the residential block above the station including improvements at street level, cycling and bus improvements as well as an improved entrance design for the Redstone Hill Station entrance.

Our Chair is arranging a private consultation to discuss these changes prior to issuing which the APC will attend and offer our help in these discussions.

The New Priory School

There are currently discussions going on between the residents and school users on changes to the planning application that was rejected by the Surrey County Council Planning group. It is believed that plans are to be revised and drawn up for another planning application to be submitted in the not so distant future.

The Civic awards 2024

Last year's Civic awards 2023 presentation evening took place at the Reigate Manor Hotel where it was great to see so many RRS members and was deemed to be a great evening.

We would like to request nominations for this year's award for projects completed recently or in the recent past that our members deem worthy of nomination.

Projects can range from outstanding buildings to public sculptures, and we will draw up a short list from the nominations to be judged later this year.

The role of the Architecture and Planning Group

To shine a bit more light on what the APC does, we wanted to lay out our aims and methods in this report which hopefully explain in a bit more detail the role and responsibility of the group. These aims and methods were revised by the group in 2021 and can be found on the RRS website under the Architecture and Planning group tab.



Architecture & Planning

Aims

- To encourage a high standard of design in new architecture and alterations to important and other relevant buildings
- Vigilance towards sustainability, human and civic values
- To promote dialogue in matters of topical, local, regional, and national planning and environmental policy
- Comments on draft proposals for County and Borough structure plans.

Methods:

- The group meets monthly with reference to society members' recommendation to discuss and comment on current planning applications which have been drawn to its attention
- To invite from members, nominations to review and recognise distinctive projects for the Reigate and Redhill Society's annual Civic Awards
- To liaise with key Borough Planning, Conservation and Green Spaces officers to understand initiatives and requirements
- To review existing conservation areas, their potential for enlargement and new proposals
- To welcome, invite and appreciate the support or involvement of corporate members

The group consists of members with strong local interests or professional knowledge. New group members are always welcome.

Updated Autumn 2021

REDHILL GROUP- PIPPA MARTIN

The climate continues to be challenging but the Chairman is optimistic for the future. Andy Nash oversees the Belfry with dedication and flair.

The Harlequin remains closed but it is reported that it may reopen in April. The Council organised an attractive circus tent in the Memorial Gardens and the Chairman attended the Pantomime performance of Beauty and the Beast in December. The Library has suffered the same fate and is closed indefinitely but Horley and Reigate libraries are extending their facilities to Redhill residents.

St Johns the Evangelist hosted an inspirational Christmas concert and St Matthews continues to stage weekly concerts on Thursdays of world class music.

The Planting of a Service tree to celebrate the Reigate and Redhill collaboration will now be suggested to the Borough.

The Surrey Mirror reported on February 1st that antisocial motorists were parking in the pedestrian centre to which Councillor Essex and aspiring Conservative MP Rebecca Paul submitted their objections.



Residents complained that pigeons were being fed in the centre and causing a public nuisance.

TRANSPORT GROUP - BRUCE HEALEY

At Gatwick Airport Station, there is an extensive history display in the northern of two station concourses for which the Reigate and Redhill Society can claim much credit. There is a moderate history behind this.

As Chairman of the Transport group, I was asked to join the local Community Rail Partnerships (CRP). Reigate has two of these, one running from Reigate to Reading and the other from Reigate to Tonbridge. Sharon Grey, the line manager for the second of these asked me to draft a railway history poster for Redhill Station. This sets out the role of Redhill in the Dunkirk evacuations. With a third of a million troops arriving randomly at Kent ports, the railways were tasked with shipping these troops out immediately. At various stations along the way, they were provided with refreshments with the WVS taking a central role in this. Most troops needed to be returned to Aldershot or Salisbury and all trains were directed up through Tonbridge and Redhill. Because of the layout at Redhill Station, this required a reversal. It was decided that steam engines would be changed at Redhill which logically became the centre of the whole operation. The railways were short handed because of military recruitment and also because the process of evacuating children was under way. The railway evacuation of Dunkirk is little remembered because nothing major went wrong. Some engine crews worked a 24 hour shift. The poster commemorating this can be seen on Redhill platform 3.

Following that, Sharon Gray asked me to work on a history poster for Reigate. One of the Reigate signalmen has a number of relevant images and one poster became two which can be seen either side of the door in the booking office.

In May 2023, the Arun Valley CRP (which runs from Gatwick to the South Coast via Arundel) were in discussions with the Gatwick Airport Station Manager about a display for a large area of unused space to open at the same time as the expanded southern station concourse. I was asked to get involved. The original brief was for 16 A0 sized panels of which I was to produce 11. With the history of the area before the airport (Gatwick is old English for Goat Farm), the racecourse, the railway and the airport it was not a problem to find enough material but a lot of work to set it out. As a large number of A0 sized panels, this would not have looked that good and fortunately, professional graphic designers were employed and they set the display out as a much larger number of smaller displays.

The content I was not involved in covered the 2020-2023 rebuild of the southern concourse and the work to widen platforms 5 and 6 and move platform7 eastwards.

Energy Action Redhill and Reigate is a community benefit society that is on a mission to make buildings in East Surrey more sustainable. Our main project is "The Leaky Homes Roadshow", currently in its second year of operation. Trained Energy Champions, equipped with thermal cameras, will survey your home to find out where you are losing heat. We can offer smart packs of energy-efficiency materials and individual suggestions on how to keep your home warm.

After publicity on the BBC, over 100 households have registered for a survey in Reigate & Banstead. The motivation for taking part varies. Some people are struggling with the price of energy and want to save money on fuel bills. Others have specific issues, such as a cold or draughty room. Many are environmentally aware and are looking for ways to reduce their carbon footprint. Learning about the energy efficiency of your home can address all these areas.

The energy surveys are free of charge as we are part of the Surrey-wide Local Energy Advice Demonstrator (LEAD) project funded through Surrey County Council. UK Power Networks are funding the energy-efficiency smart packs and loft insulation.
